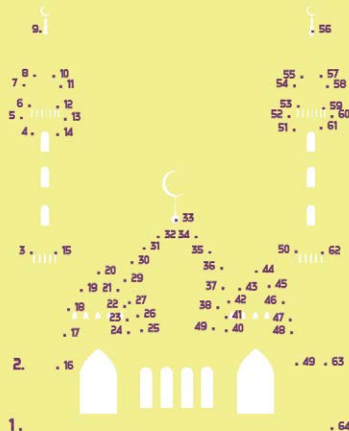

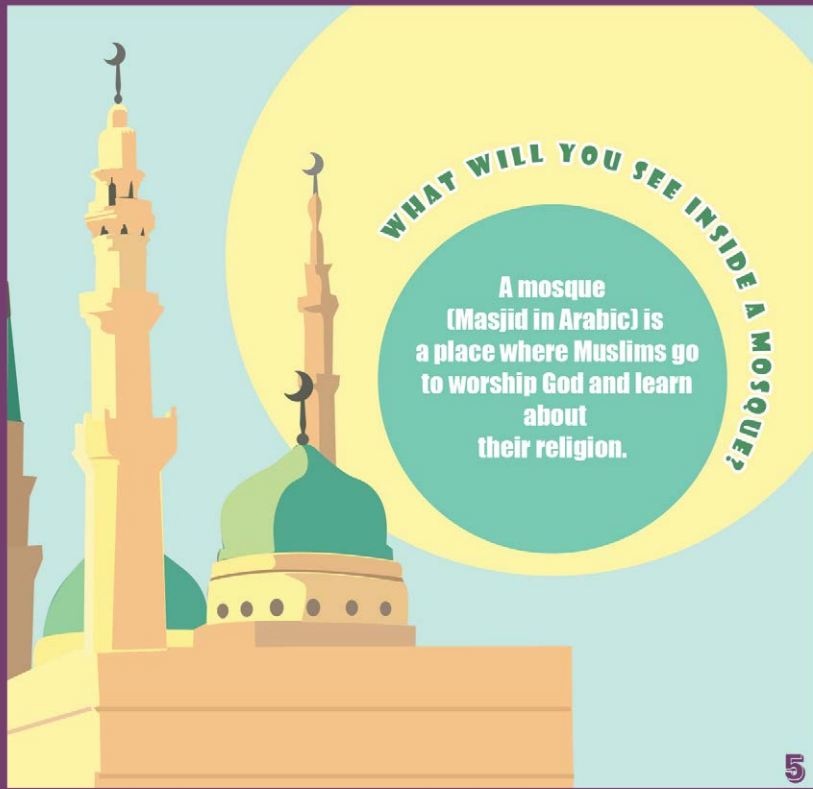

WHAT WILL YOU SEE INSIDE A MOSQUE?

A mosque  
(Masjid in Arabic) is  
a place where Muslims go  
to worship God and learn  
about  
their religion.

The main hall of a mosque is a bare room. No furniture is needed, as worshippers sit, stand, bow, and prostrate directly on the floor, which is often covered with large prayer carpets. There may be a few chairs or benches on which to sit to assist elderly or disabled worshippers.

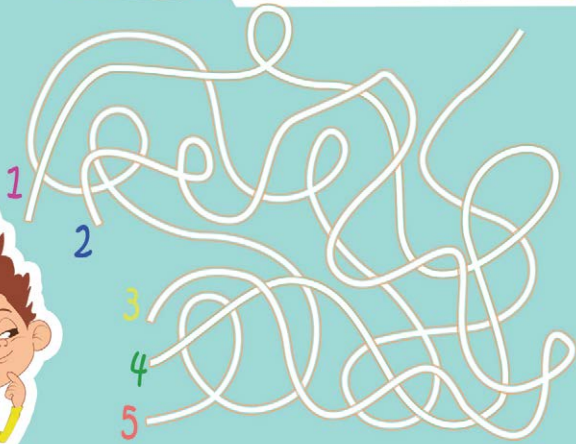
There are no pictures or statues. Muslims believe that there can be no image of God. Instead, along the walls and pillars are inscriptions of verses from the holy book of Islam, the Noble Qur'an, and also the Most Beautiful Names of God.

Splendid geometric and floral patterns (known as arabesques) and calligraphic designs usually adorn the main doors, walls, and pillars. Glass lamps of various colors are often hung from the ceiling with chains to lighten the interior of the mosque.



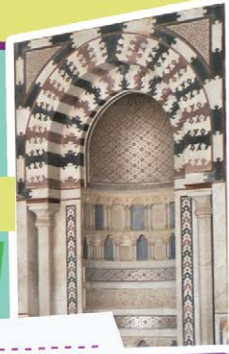

## How should you behave inside the mosque?



We remove our shoes and place them on the rack in the entryway out of respect for the place and to avoid dirtying the carpets.



We enter quietly to avoid disturbing other worshippers. As we walk in we avoid passing in front of a person praying, and then we sit or pray in any free space.



We greet people with Salam (saying: peace be upon you) when we enter or leave the mosque.

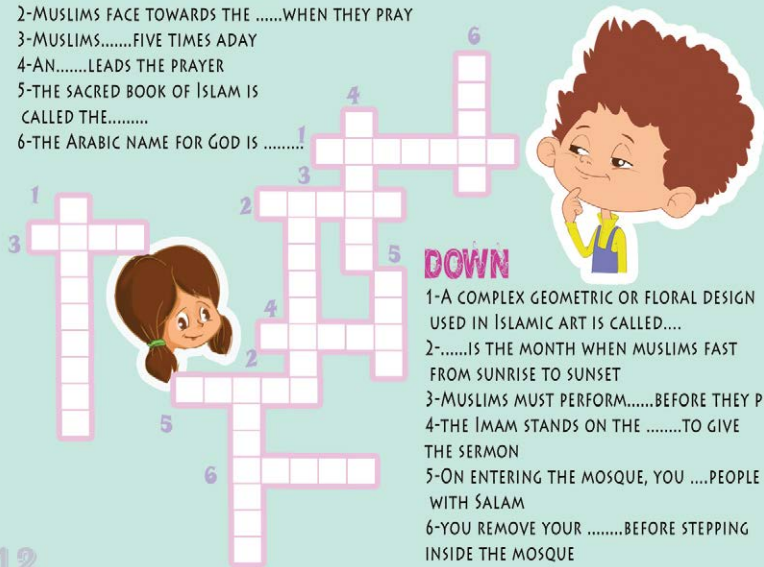


We keep the mosque clean, tidy, and pleasant smelling because it is the House of God.

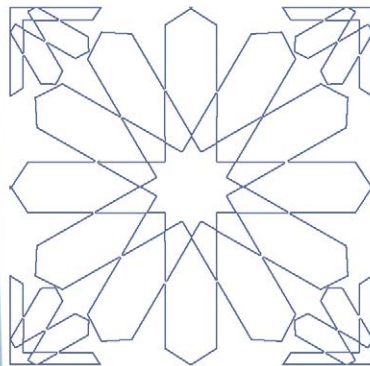

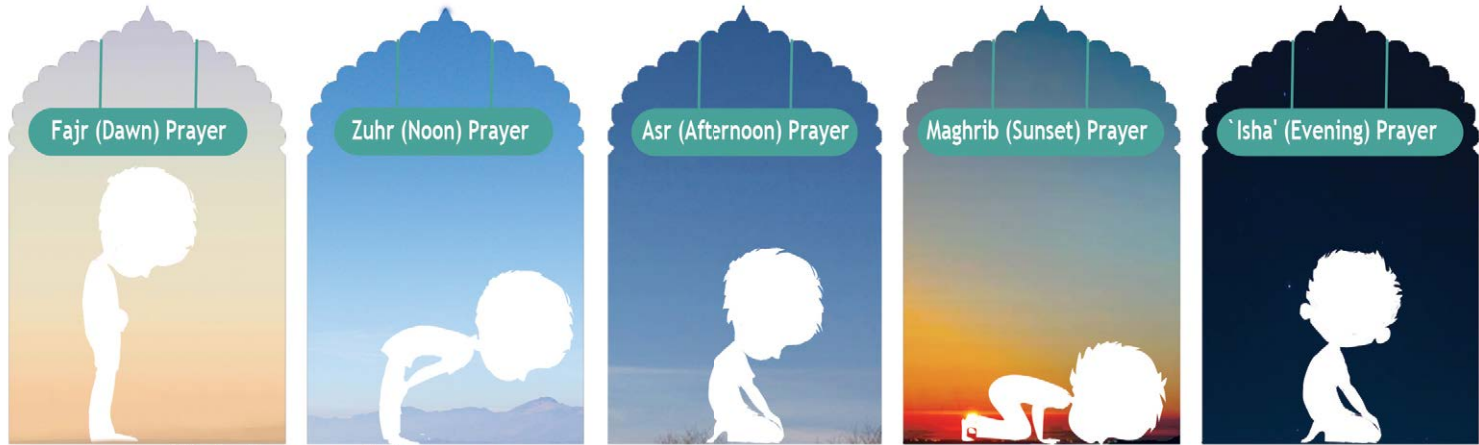

# How OFTEN DO MUSLIMS PRAY ?

Muslims pray five times a day. The times of the five prayers are spread throughout the day to maintain a constant connection with God and His Guidance. These five prayers are:



Ablution is necessary before prayer.

Each prayer takes 5 to 10 minutes to perform and consists of a series of actions – standing, bowing, prostrating twice,

and sitting – during which verses from the Qur'an and supplications are recited.

One complete cycle is called a unit of prayer (Rak'ah in Arabic).

The Dawn Prayer consists of 2 units; the Noon, Afternoon, and Evening Prayers each consist of 4 units; and the Sunset Prayer consists of 3 units.

## Join each prayer to its correct timing

The Noon Prayer  
is performed at 12 o'clock  
midday

The Night Prayer  
is performed any time  
between twilight and dawn

The Sunset Prayer  
is performed immediately  
after sunset

The Dawn Prayer  
is performed at daybreak

between noon and sunset

### PRAYING TOGETHER IN THE MOSQUE BRINGS MUSLIMS TOGETHER

All five prayers are held in congregation  
in the mosques every day.

The congregation is led by a person called an Imam.

The people in the congregation stand behind the Imam,  
in straight parallel rows, facing the direction of Mecca (Qiblah).

They stand side by side, bow side by side,  
and prostrate humbly side by side to the  
One and Only God.

## WHAT IS ISLAM



### It's

the belief in only one God.

Allah is the Arabic word for God. He is the same God worshipped by Jesus, Muhammad and all the prophets.

He is the Creator of everything.

Islam is an Arabic word which means voluntary submission to God alone. The root of the word Islam comes from the word salam, meaning peace. It is through submission to God's Will that a person finds peace

A Muslim is a person who submits to God by choosing to follow His Guidance in every part of their life.

Muslims amount to a quarter of the world's population, which is about 1.6 billion people.

(SAWM)  
TO FAST (I.E., NOT TO EAT OR DRINK FROM SUNRISE TO SUNSET) DURING DAYLIGHT HOURS IN THE MONTH OF RAMADAN.

5  
PILGRIMAGE  
(HAJJ)  
TO MAKE PILGRIMAGE TO MECCA AT LEAST ONCE IN A LIFETIME, IF ONE IS ABLE TO AND CAN AFFORD THE JOURNEY.

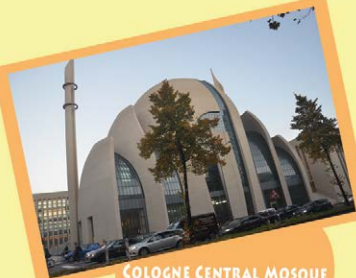

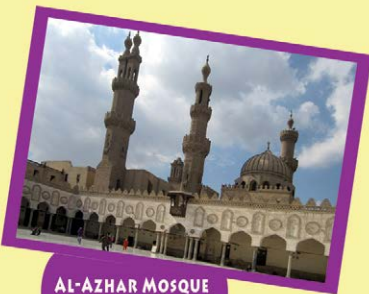




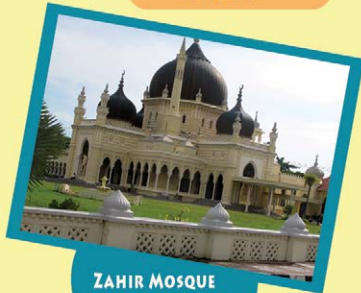
